 As a parent you have the right to request information regarding the professional qualifications of the classroom staff (certified and noncertified paraprofessionals) working with your child.


• If at any time your student has been taught for four consecutive weeks by a teacher that is not highly qualified, then you will be notified by the school.



Istation Literacy: September 2021





Istation Literacy: May 2022




Istation Math: September 2021








